### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL BUNDLE SUNDAY

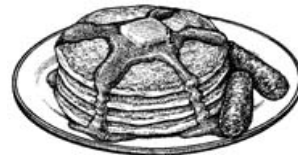

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Around the turn of the fourth century, Augustine, still fairly fresh from the baptismal waters in Milan, was elected bishop of a tiny city in North Africa, Hippo. He told his people, “While I am frightened by what I am for you, then I am consoled by what I am with you. For you I am a bishop, with you I am a Christian.” He had his priorities right, and also knew that everyone coming from the water arises with a ministry, a specific role, in bringing about God’s kingdom.

If we were asked to purge English of Greek vocabulary, we would gain an insight into key ministries in our church. Bishop, from the Greek *episkopos*, would become simply “overseer;” priest, from the Greek *presbyter*, would become “elder;” and deacon, from the Greek *diakonos*, would be “servant.” Each title stands in relationship to all the baptized, serving the community, helping it to be the Body of Christ. In our deepest tradition, each of these ordained ministries is attuned to help us become our best selves; to hunger and thirst for the coming of God’s kingdom. The goal for each one of us is to be able to recognize the presence of Christ in worship and in service. Although only some of us are ordained to ministry, each of us is called to ministry.

during this Jubilee of Mercy Year

Holy Father Pope Francis has asked everyone, each according to his or her ability, to participate in a pilgrimage to embrace God's mercy, and dedicate ourselves to being merciful with others. Faithful throughout the Diocese of Oakland are invited individually, or as a parish group, to experience a prayerful and transformation journey at the Cathedral. We are encouraged to pray for the gifts of the Year of Mercy: forgiveness, reconciliation and conversion, in light of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy.

We as a parish have scheduled Saturday, October 1st, 2016, from 10 a.m. till noon at the Cathedral for our own program, starting at 10 a.m. and concluding at noon. We will have Eucharistic Adoration at 10 a.m. followed by Mass at 11 a.m. For those interested, a Cathedral tour is available at noon.
