Dear Friends,

February 10th is Ash Wednesday! It is the beginning of the season of Lent; a special season of renewal and conversion.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that Jesus' call to conversion and penance leads interior conversion. Conversion, argues Saint Thomas Aquinas, means a change in the deepest part of our heart. Therefore, to convert ourselves, we need to change our way of life and our way of thinking so that our soul can become closer to God. And as Pope Francis says, "Conversion means breaking with idols to turn to the living God in a personal encounter" (cf. Lumen Fidei, 13).

Interior repentance is a radical reorientation of our whole life, a return, a conversion to God with all our heart, an end to sin, a turning away from evil, with repugnance toward the evil actions we have committed. And at the same time, it entails the desire and resolution to change one's life, with hope in God's mercy and trust in the help of his grace.

In order to renew ourselves, we need the following convictions:

- 1) The conviction of the primacy of God in our lives. God is the first. The first and greatest commandment is the love of God above all things.
- 2) The second conviction we need is that we must recognize ourselves as sinners. And this is a truth of our lives. We are sinners; we belong to a sinful race. Our first fathers were sinners, and we are members of the same nature. We must be humble, because God resists the proud and gives his grace to the humble.
- 3) Finally, we must be convinced that we need a Redeemer, Jesus Christ. Therefore, we must follow Him, follow his commandments and his teachings so that at the end of life we might live with Him forever in heaven.

Conversion is a gift from God. Conversion is first of all a work of the grace of God who makes our hearts return to him. He gives us the strength to begin anew. It is in discovering the greatness of God's love that our heart is shaken by the horror and weight of sin and begins to fear offending God by sin and being separated from him. The human heart is converted by looking upon him whom our sins have pierced.

We see how the Church with maternal solicitude tries to help us understand that the true joy springs from a heart in friendship with God, that is, in God's grace. There cannot be true lasting joy in a heart full of sin; simply, because sin carries with it sadness, and separation. Let us make this Holy season of Lent a season of Love of God and our neighbor.
