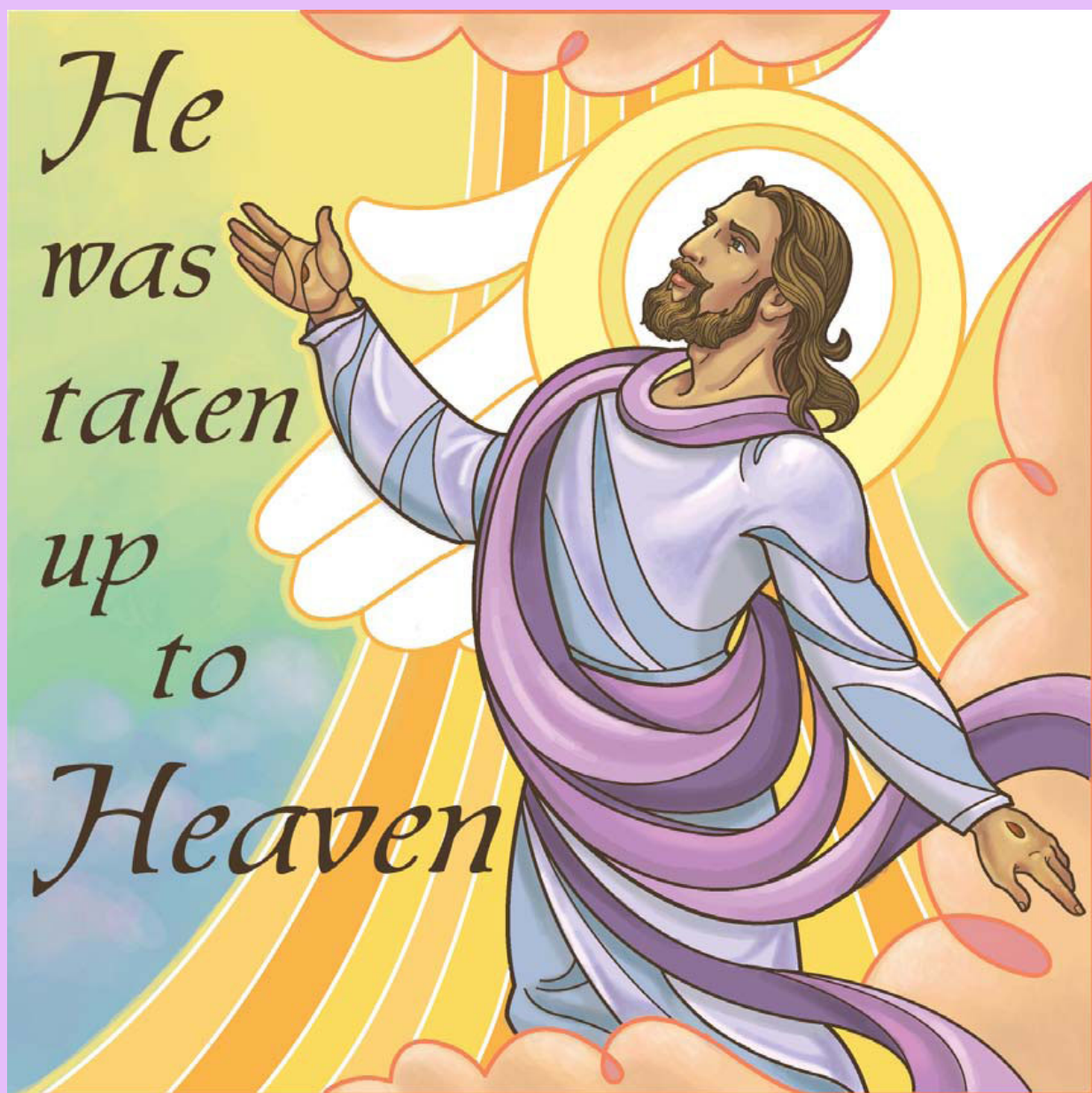

“As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven.” (Luke 24:51)

The Gospel of St. Luke ends with the Ascension of the Lord. This scene is also the transition to St. Luke's Acts of the Apostles. As we hear in Acts 1:10, the apostles are staring into the sky watching Jesus ascend. A couple of men dressed in white garments ask them who they are looking for.

This amazing scene can serve as an allegory, a spiritual picture that can be interpreted to reveal a hidden meaning. It might be fun to see this in a little humor. When I was in chaplaincy training, one of the chaplains who embraced Buddhism as her primary belief told us this joke:

A monk was riding an ox and a group of people humbly asked who he was looking for. He answered: “I am looking for an ox.” They all laughed and he continued on his way up the road, where he was again asked the same question only to start people laughing. Finally, he came to a Christian mission where they told him he was being ridiculous, that he was already riding on an ox. He answered: “So it is with you looking for God.” Hmm. The story might serve to illustrate how the early church had to find its way building up the Kingdom of God here on earth, and not stare at the heavens waiting for Jesus to return. We might also see the story as a reminder of what we seek being part of our *everyday call* to serve others. How do we view the elderly or infirmed? Are they who we are seeking?

I've got one more story. Perhaps you've heard it—but it still works: After a parish evening meeting, a guy lost his car keys and was looking for them under a streetlight. A parishioner came out of the hall and offered to help him. Pretty soon he had lots of helpers and one person asked him to retrace his steps—“where exactly, do you think you lost them?” He answered: “Probably over there by the statue where I said a prayer.” “Then why are you looking for them over here?” He answered: “The light's better over here.”

Sometimes we may be looking for God in all the wrong places. I think some country singer gave me that idea. But the truth is, Christ is found in all the places we may have decided to avoid. Let us grow beyond the idea that God is only found in the sky or bright lights of fun projects. Let us realize that the call to service is not about seeking rewards. But when we bring *The Light of Christ* into the hearts of others, we find Jesus.

Postscript: I have always loved a little saying from Mother Teresa: “You don't have to do great things—just small things with great love.”

REVISITING OUR BAPTISM

A mere seven weeks ago thousands of new Church members were baptized. Their new life in Christ has once again infused new life into the Church. Their new-found faith has inspired and bolstered the faith of those who have followed Christ for many years. As the Easter season nears its end, we revisit the scene of our baptisms. In the second reading we hear Christ calling us: "Come. . . . Let . . . the one who wants it receive the gift of life-giving water" (Revelation 22:17).

But our baptism is not one of water only. John refers to washed robes, and we know that this washing is to be "in the blood of the Lamb." To make sure we get this message, we have today's first reading from Acts. It is the story of Stephen, the first Christian to be killed for his faith in Jesus. We remember the promise and also the cost of being a disciple of Christ.
